

HPHA POOL RULES - 2010

I agree to use the pool in accordance with the following rules, which supersede all other published pool rules. **I understand that I am responsible for the safety and actions of my children and guests, regardless of my absence at the pool.** Violation of these rules or requests made by the Pool Manager may, at the discretion of the Holiday Park Homeowners Association (HPHA) Board of Directors, result in forfeiture of my pool key and right to use the pool.

- Every HPHA resident or family who wishes to use the pool must have a current **signed Release Of Liability form on file** each year with the Pool Managers (see attached).
- Each parent is solely responsible for the safety and behavior of their children and guests regardless of the age of their children and guests.
- **Children under 10 years old** are **NOT ALLOWED** in the pool or pool area unless accompanied by an adult (18 years or older) who is responsible for their safety. The presence of the Pool Manager does not satisfy this requirement.
- **Children 10 to 13 years old** are allowed in the pool and pool area at the discretion of their parents, provided the parent signs the attached waiver in addition to signing the attached release form. For children in this age group, the waiver must be filled out each year.
- **Children 14 years and older** are allowed in the pool and pool area at the discretion of their parents, subject to the conditions stated in the "Release of Liability" attached.
- To gain access to the pool, the door must be opened with a key. Those in the pool area must either possess a pool key or be accompanied by someone who has a pool key.
- The gate to the pool must be kept locked at all times and should never be propped open.
- No glass or similar material that will shatter on impact is allowed in the pool area. No bikes, roller blades, skateboards, or pets are allowed in the pool area.
- All swimmers must wear swim attire only; no cut-off jeans, underwear, or other street wear is permitted.
- No running or horseplay in the pool area. No playing with pool furniture.
- No playing loud radios or creating noise that might be offensive to others using the pool or living nearby.
- No clothing, towels, toys etc. should be left in the pool area. Those using the pool should clean up after themselves, disposing of trash in the waste containers.
- No cooking in the pool area.
- Smokers should extinguish and dispose of cigarettes properly. Buckets are available for this use. It is illegal for those under the age of 18 years old to smoke.
- Only the Pool Manager or authorized personnel are permitted to use the pool maintenance equipment. Life saving equipment is to be used only in emergency situations.

- Guests are allowed subject to the party policy stated below and the rules governing HPHA members use of the pool. HPHA members are responsible for the actions of their guests and must accompany their guests when using the pool.
- An adult must supervise guests younger than 14 years old. No more than 3 guests between the ages of 14 through 17 are allowed in the pool without the supervision of an adult.
- Any pool-side activity not specifically covered by the pool rules must be cleared with the Pool Manager or a Pool Chairperson.

POOL AREA PARTY POLICY:

The pool cannot be closed for private parties. Small parties, not to exceed 25, may be held only upon payment of a non-refundable pool use fee of **\$25**, deposit of **\$200** with the Treasurer or a Pool Chairperson to cover potential damage or non-cleanup. Groups of 10 or more non-residents, or any group of 20 or more, are considered to be a party. Parties are limited to 3 hours maximum. Advance notice of at least 2 days must be given to the Pool Chairperson. Member must also pay for an additional Pool Manager to be on duty during the party (at \$10/hr). A resident's HOA dues must be current to be eligible to reserve the pool for a party.

One adult resident (18 years or older), must be present at all parties. Children's parties must have adequate adult (18 years or older) supervision. Music and noise should not be offensive to other residents. Parties should disband by 9:00 p.m. Failure to comply with these guidelines could result in fines and/or loss of pool privileges for the homeowner.

FINES: Clean-up: \$50 per hour, per person. Repairs: Actual damages plus 20% punitive damages. Any City Code Fines: (e.g. glass containers in the pool area may result in a fine from the city ranging from \$50 to \$200 levied against both the resident and HPHA).
